Job pathways mentoring

Brother to Another will provide mentorship to accessing pathways to the health and community services sectors. Including job ready workshopping how to write resume and apply for jobs and training opertunities

Work site tours

We will visit community and health services job sites to speak to Aboriginal staff about their work experiences and what pathways they took to get into positions they are currently in.

Cultural

Being an Aboriginal charity Brother to Another is in a unique position with our own lived experiences. We are able to help young Aboriginal people understand the challenges culturally and professionally they might face on a day to day basis in the work place, in the community and at home.



Morning session work site tour

During the morning session we will visit various health and community services work sites to explore what positions are available, we will also explore what the pathways are to get into professional health and community services

Lunch & Cultural immersion

Lunch will be provided by Brother to Another.

During the lunch break we will travel to a significant cultural site to talk about how traditional roles in the Aboriginal community can relate to current job roles in various work places and how culture can play a positive role in the workplace.

Afternoon session Workshop

A wellbeing and job readiness workshop where to look for work, how to apply for work, what training opportunities are available and what are the pathways to get work in the health and community services sectors. We will role play over the phone and face to face interviews.
